Letters, notes, testimonials, client stories: We have a family about to "graduate" from the FSS Program. She earned \$5,323 in the FSS escrow account, which she will be given at graduation. The main goal of the FSS program is to obtain full-time employment and be off public assistance for at least a year. The head of household of this family is a single mom with two children ages 8 and 5. She has been working for a local bank for the past two years. In November, she moved into the house that she built using the Self-Help Housing Program. The Section 8 Homeownership Program will assist her in making her house payment for a while longer.
